## RODEO TEAM COACH – JORDAN COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURAL SCIENCES AND TECHNOLOGY JOB ANNOUNCEMENT #18-945

<p><b>POSITION SUMMARY:</b></p>	<p><b>Benefited position with the Jordan College of Agricultural Sciences and Technology through the California State University, Fresno Foundation.</b> Under the general direction of the Chair of the Animal Sciences and Agricultural Education Department, the Rodeo Team Coach is expected to continue to develop and apply a comprehensive and functional rodeo program that develops participants as both athletes and students. Fresno State has a long tradition and history in the sport of rodeo, as our rodeo has been held every year since 1949, and is only one of two universities in the western region to have continuously maintained a program. The program has grown recently and currently has 44 student athletes active in the National Intercollegiate Rodeo Association (NIRA). Position will be for a minimum of 50% time (20 hours per week), with hours flexible during competition season.</p>
<p><b>ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:</b></p>	<p>Under the direction of the Chair, the incumbent will be responsible for the areas listed below. Typical duties include, but are not limited to, the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mentor athletes in their activities and academic progress</li> <li>• Identify and recruit quality student athletes</li> <li>• Plans, directs, and coaches an intercollegiate men’s and women’s rodeo program in all NIRA events and practice; develops student athletes fullest potential while being regionally competitive and ethically run; ensures NIRA rules and regulation compliance; recruits rodeo team members and assists them in meeting individual and team goal; recruits student athletes who have the ability to achieve academic and athletic success; supports general student recruitment in cooperation with the admissions office</li> <li>• Provides quality coaching and instruction to students participating in the college rodeo program; develops, enforces safety regulations and procedures through supervision of students</li> <li>• Maintain and enforce team rules regarding academic, athletic and social expectations</li> <li>• Provides ongoing oversight of student athlete’s conduct both in and out of the arena; assists with conflict resolution; provides guidance with negotiating campus processes such as registration, financial aid, residence life; assists with the development of positive interpersonal relationships including campus integration with other students and faculty</li> <li>• Coordinate the following activities with the Fresno State Farm Manager:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Develop practice and competition schedules</li> <li>○ Identify needs for the rodeo program</li> <li>○ Assist with maintenance of rodeo facilities</li> <li>○ Ensure safety of student athletes</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Develop a comprehensive training program</li> <li>• Assist in developing and managing the rodeo program annual budget for the facility and program operation; monitors expenditures including allocation of scholarships, and develops and implements a successful fund raising plan to meet program needs, goals, and objectives</li> <li>• Work with University personnel to market the rodeo program</li> <li>• Supervise and coordinate rodeo events and activities, including attending scheduled rodeo practices, classes and NIRA West Coast Region rodeos and College National Finals Rodeo; coordinate and ensures rodeo stock and arena are well maintained</li> <li>• Coordinate outreach and fundraising initiatives with University personnel</li> <li>• Adhere to all University and NIRA rules and regulations</li> <li>• Other duties as assigned</li> </ul>
